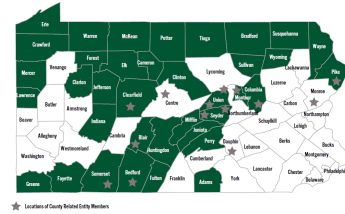

The CCAP UC Trust offers the **Risk Control Incentive Program** to recognize the annual risk control activities conducted within each member county and county related entity. Properly implemented risk control activities, such as education, updated policies and procedures and timely reporting, can help reduce the costs of unemployment charges before a separation even occurs. UC Trust Members have the opportunity to earn up to **5%** towards their quarterly contributions to the Trust.

Spring Building Maintenance



As the spring months bring warmer temperatures and rainy days, it is an important time of year for building and property maintenance. Unkempt locations pose serious health and safety risks, as well as expensive fixes if not maintained regularly.

Spring Maintenance Checklist

- **Service air conditioning units and inspect ductwork** to ensure systems are operating efficiently, unaffected by winter debris or wear and ready for warmer weather demands.
- **Schedule boiler and heating system inspections** to confirm proper shutdown or transition and address any issues discovered during winter operation.
- **Trim trees and shrubs**, particularly those hanging over roofs, walkways, or parking areas, to prevent damage, improve visibility, and reduce storm-related risks.
- **Pressure wash walkways, patios, and other hardscapes** to remove algae, salt residue, and grime that can create slippery conditions.

- **Inspect exterior masonry, lighting, signage, and fixtures** for cracks, loose components, or weather-related damage that could compromise safety or accessibility.
- **Clear debris from roofs, gutters, and downspouts** to promote proper drainage and prevent water infiltration or ice damage carryover from winter.
- **Inspect parking lots and grounds** for pooling water, erosion, or drainage issues caused by spring rains and snowmelt.
- **Ensure waste and recycling receptacles are clean**, structurally sound, and appropriately placed to support sanitation and pest control efforts.

Consistent maintenance of county buildings and grounds plays a vital role in maintaining safe conditions for staff and visitors while preserving public investments. By prioritizing spring maintenance, counties can reduce liability risks, extend the life of their facilities and provide reliable, well-maintained spaces that support essential government services throughout the year.

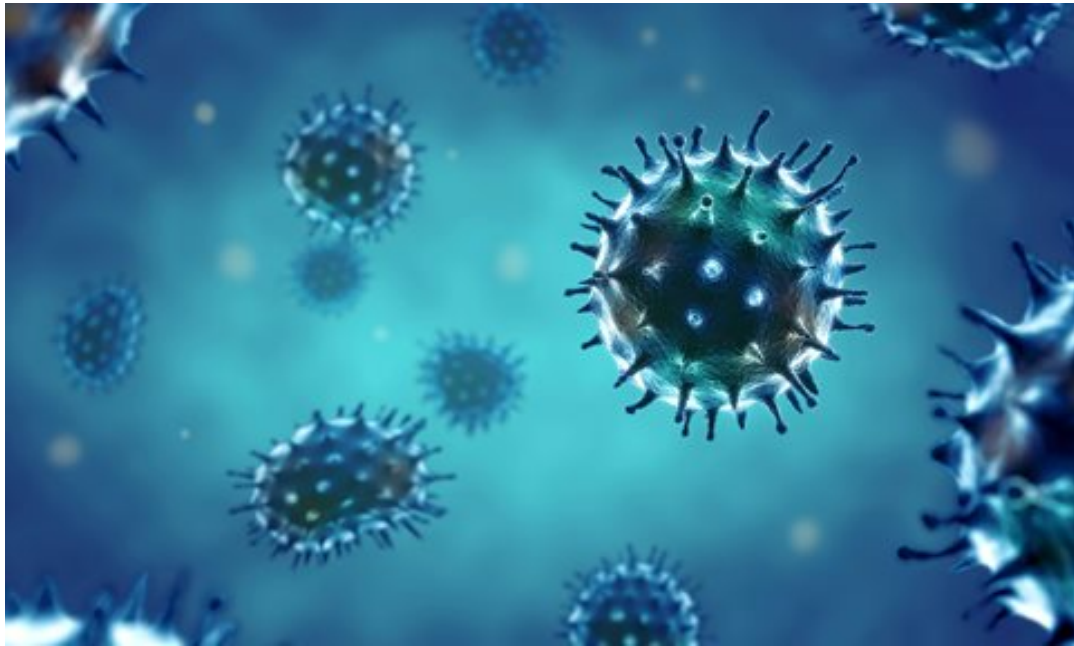
