EIGP Funding for Counties

The Election Integrity Grant Program (EIGP) provides funding to support the work of county governments and their election offices.

Funding amounts are based on the number of registered voters within each county during the previous primary election. For details on individual county allocations, please reference the [EIGP County Allocation](#).

County election officials may apply for EIGP grants between August 1-15, 2026.

If your county is interested in applying for this grant, please don't delay. Keep in mind that your application may require internal approvals—such as a vote by the commissioners—depending on your local requirements. The application window opens on August 1.

The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) is now accepting applications for funding under the Rights and Services Act (RSA) and Victims of Juvenile Offenders (VOJO) programs.

A total of \$10,440,724 in federal and state funds is being announced to support this initiative in Year 1 project period, January 1, 2027-December 31, 2027. This is a non-competitive award, and each County can find what funding is available for their application in Appendix A and B beginning on page 18 of the [Funding Announcement](#).

The primary purpose of these funds is to support responsibilities assigned to prosecution and juvenile probation under the Crime Victims Act, the Juvenile Act, and Pennsylvania's Rules of Juvenile Court Procedure. The goal and objective of RSA and VOJO funding is to ensure that victims of crime whose cases are processed within the criminal and juvenile justice systems receive all rights, notifications, and services (also known as procedural services) to which they are entitled to under the law.

Applications must be submitted electronically through [PCCD's Egrants](#) system no later than 11:59 PM on **Friday, September 11, 2026**.

DOE Regional Feedback Session on the 2026 National Transmission Needs Study

On Thursday, August 6th, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) will host a regional feedback session in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on the recently released draft of the [2026 Transmission Needs Study](#).

DOE is inviting relevant stakeholders from Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia to participate.

Assistant Secretary for DOE's Office of Electricity, Katie Jereza, will provide opening remarks, followed by an overview of the study. DOE has advised that local input is essential to assessing current and near-term future transmission needs across the U.S. electric grid. DOE will invite public feedback during the session.

Snyder County Commissioner and CCAP President Joe Kantz joined Union County Commissioner and Chair of CCAP's Election Reform Committee, Jeff Reber, at a Col. John Kelly grave marking event on Saturday, July 25, in Lewisburg, PA.

Kantz was invited to attend by a high school classmate, Steve Troutman, a direct descendant of Col. Kelly and a member of the Sons of the American Revolution.

During the ceremony, Troutman shared the story of Col. John Kelly's service, highlighting his role in carrying out direct orders from General George Washington and his contributions to the American victory in the Revolutionary War. The event

served as a meaningful tribute to local history and the enduring legacy of those who helped shape the nation.

On July 22, the House advanced the SAVE America Act —via the National Defense Authorization Act and a budget reconciliation framework—each with significant implications for counties. Both measures now move to the Senate.
