PIMCC: Prison Inmate Medical Cost Containment

The Prison Inmate Medical Cost Containment (PIMCC) program is organized under the sponsorship of CCAP as a Pennsylvania intergovernmental cooperative. PIMCC provides various services to assist counties with their correctional medical departments through Act 22 Services and through the PIMCC Membership.


PIMCC and Act 22 Services

In October 2011, the PIMCC program began serving as the county liaison with the Department of Human Services and the Department of Corrections. For inmate medical services, Act 22 caps outpatient medical fees at the Medicare rates and inpatient hospital fees at Medicaid rates. The PIMCC Act 22 Services are specific to inpatient hospital services only and revolve around the payment of the inpatient hospital bills, which are handled through PIMCC. All Pennsylvania counties can benefit from Act 22 inpatient related services regardless of whether or not they hold membership in PIMCC. With the enactment of Act 22, Pennsylvania counties have experienced a savings of 95 percent on inmate inpatient claims.

PIMCC Membership

PIMCC Membership provides additional savings to its members through inmate outpatient medical bill audits, hospital case management, and reports which include facility trends, bill activity reconciliation and pharmacy activity. The reports along with onsite meetings allow opportunities to review for potential savings. The program also assists in obtaining provider services through PIMCC partners and other contract negotiations.

PELICAN Grant Reminder



The PELICAN Loss Prevention Grant Program is designed to support the nursing home's safety committee and administration by awarding grants to offset the costs of enhancing safety, maintenance and risk management programs.

As a reminder, subscribers may receive a maximum of \$5,000 for the current policy period. PELICAN subscribers must submit their fully completed and signed grant applications by **February 28, 2026**.

PCoRP Grant Reminder



PCoRP (Pennsylvania County Risk Pool) members must submit their fully completed and signed Safety and Wellness grant applications by **May 31, 2026**. Grant applications will be considered, assessed and subject to PCoRP's grant offering and requirements.

The purpose of the PCoRP Loss Prevention Grant Program is to provide the members with the opportunity to fund loss prevention projects for their county or county related entity. The maximum grant amount is up to \$25,000 per member.

Boiler Inspection Reminder



One of the many value-added services offered by PCoRP is the inspection of boilers and associated machinery. These inspections are critical to the operational safety for staff, visitors and property. CNA is the contracted service provider performing these inspection services on behalf of PCoRP.

PCoRP members can contact CNA to request a jurisdictional inspections through any of the following methods:

After successfully contacting CNA, be prepared to provide the following information which will expedite your inspection request:

1. Member/Inspection Contact Name, Title, Phone Number
2. Member/Inspection Contact Email Address
3. Member Facility/Location Name (where the objects are located)
4. Member Facility/Location Address (complete street, city, state, zip)
5. Reason for Inspection (new installation, certificate renewal, follow-up inspection, other)
6. Additional Details for the Inspector (boiler/pressure vessel identification, need-by date)

Additionally, if a member experiences an accident involving their boiler, CNA requires the following action be taken:

- Immediately following (within 24 hours) the incident, the owner, user or operator must notify CNA of the accident.
- Upon notice of the accident, a CNA inspector will be assigned to investigate.
- Until such time as an inspector arrives to investigate the incident, no one should remove or otherwise disturb the boiler, pressure vessel or related parts or equipment, unless absolutely necessary to
- prevent harm to persons or property.
- Before the unit is brought back into service, it must pass inspection.
- Within five (5) days of the accident, the owner, user or operator must file a fully completed copy of a Boiler or Unfired Pressure Vessel Accident Report (LIBI-306).
- CNA will suspend the certificate of operation and seal a boiler or unfired pressure vessel that is unsafe.



Pennsylvania Influenza Update



Pennsylvania is experiencing a significant active influenza season. Health officials report very high influenza activity, with cases and hospitalizations climbing sharply since late autumn and the holiday season. As of January 10, 2026, 61,139 lab-confirmed flu cases have been reported this season, including 71 flu-related deaths.

The dominant flu strain, Influenza A (H3N2), is contributing to prolonged and more severe illness patterns than in recent years.

Health guidance includes vaccination for everyone aged six months and older to reduce the risk of getting or spreading influenza, and to reduce the risk of severe disease and complications if you have influenza.

Additional recommendations include:

- Wash hands frequently
- Covering your cough and/or sneeze
- Washing frequent touch surfaces with approved anti-viral cleaner
- Staying home if you are ill
- Contacting your healthcare provider early so anti-viral treatment can be started.
- Contact your healthcare provider if you experience increased or urgent symptoms such as difficulty breathing or chest pain.

PA data shows a moderate decline in influenza cases. However, historically, a second peak in activity is expected after a short decline. What does that mean for you? Don't let your guard down and continue prevention efforts to keep yourself and those around you safe this flu season.

More than 6,000 people fall off a ladder and die each year, and over 400,000 people deal with power tool injuries each year. With these numbers in mind, equipment safety can no longer be a topic that is overlooked.
